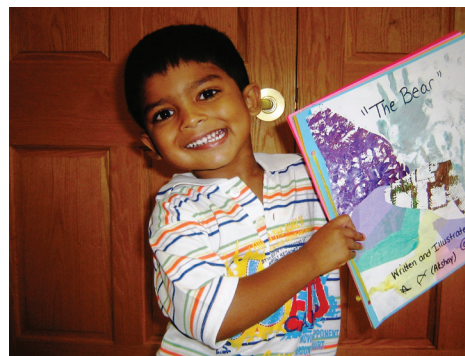

# PJS Summer Camp Themes

*The Summer Camp Program at PJS encourages children to develop independence and explore their physical world. Each week-long session will introduce the children to varying facets of the world by focusing on different topics.*

## **Week 1: Messy, Messy Art 7/5-7/8 (4 Days)**

When you're a kid, nothing is more fun than getting as messy as possible, so why not create art projects while you do it? Join us as we explore new art techniques and create fabulous art through methods such as body painting or confetti collage, all the while seeing just how creative we can be



## **Week 2: Young Authors 7/11-7/15**

Do you love to read? Are you full of ideas for new stories? We will read lots of favorite books, and then use them as examples to create stories of our own. Working together, we will explore different methods for creating a story, including storytelling, flannel boards, and photographs. We will finish our week with a publishing party, where we proudly share our finished books.

## **Week 3: Journey to Outer Space 7/18-7/22**

Have you ever looked up at the sky and wondered just what is up there? Get ready for some out of this world fun as we become astronauts for a week, learning all about the moon and the stars, creating our own telescopes and planetarium, and even building a rocket ship. 3,2,1 Blast-off!



## **Week 4: The Wonders of Water 7/25-7/29**

Water, water everywhere! Cool off in the heat of the summer by learning all about water! We will experiment with freezing and melting, use water in our art projects, and make some fantastic bubbles! After our scientific discovery is complete, we'll grab our swim suits and towels for some good, cool water play.

## **Week 5: Dinosaurs Roar 8/1-8/5**

Are you fascinated by dinosaurs? Where did they come from? Why aren't they here now? Come join us as we discover the difference between carnivore and herbivore, unearth some fossils (then create some of our own!), and finally build our very own large scale papier-mache dinosaurs. We will create our very own prehistoric park!



## **Week 6: The Young Naturalist: 8/8-8/12**

There is more to being a naturalist than simply collecting and identifying animals and plants. Join us as we learn to observe our natural world through experiments, habitat observations and nature walks. As we learn, we will be contributing to conservation efforts, and focusing on the importance of living with nature.



## **Week 7: Construct It: 8/15-8/19**

Have you ever looked at a skyscraper and thought, someday I will build something like that? Well, the day is now! Together, we will design eye-popping structures, using as many different materials and methods as we can imagine. The possibilities are endless as we glue, tape, and secure our skyscrapers to our heart's content, creating some pretty incredible designs.

# Get Ready for Kindergarten

*The Kindergarten Readiness Program at PJS provides a bridge between Pre-school and the increased expectations of Kindergarten. There are two, one-week sessions offered to children enrolled in Kindergarten for fall 2011.*

## **Week 1: 6/20-6/24; Week 2: 8/22-8/26**

Is your child getting ready to enter Kindergarten? Give them a chance to explore what it's like to be in elementary school. We will focus on three major areas: *classroom procedures*, including skills such as good listening, social problem solving and basic day-to-day routines; *fine motor development*, focusing on the skills needed for activities such as coloring, cutting and gluing; and an *introduction to the academics of Kindergarten*, including concepts found in reading, writing and mathematics. Get your child ready to begin school in September with a variety of strategies to help them succeed!
